8. Community Safety & Well Being Report

Louisa Costanzo, Manager – Community Safety & Well-Being provided a detailed Managers Report. Document included for your review.

A discussion relative to the outreach of the Community Safety & Well Being Advisory Committee survey was held.

Jason Veltri, Chair and Louisa Costanzo, Manger – Community Safety & Well-Being working collectively on obtaining a list of contacts from the existing Advisory Committee members. An introduction email to be provided to send

along with the survey to their contacts. In addition, the reach will extend to various other groups and businesses.

Students from Confederation College and Lakehead University have received the survey link. A suggestion made to include the whole organization of both.

Lakehead Public School Board, Thunder Bay Catholic School Board, Matawa Education and all youth groups including trustees and students should be contacted to participate.

Louisa Costanzo, Manager – Community Safety & Well-Being continues to expand the reach of the survey through facilitated sessions, i.e.: Age Friendly Thunder Bay.

9. Strategic Plan Action Table

Legislation prescribes that specific areas require urgent action while using existing tables:

- social development,
- prevention,
- risk intervention
- incident response

Louisa Costanzo, Manager – Community Safety & Well-Being provided four questions for the committee to discuss.

- What elements of our current CSWB Plan are working well and should be carried forward?
- Where do you see gaps, challenges, or opportunities for improvement?
- What new or emerging priorities should we consider as we refresh the plan?
- How can the committee strengthen how we work together and connect with the broader community?

Discussion:

- A primary concern of the Advisory Committee is having everything as a priority resulting in nothing being a priority.
- Some tracking has taken place regarding the 30 key indicators. To date there is not a formal evaluation available due to staff shortage.
- The process to inform the community has been through providing presentations and annual reports to City Council.

- The priority regarding measuring indicators, moving forward with evaluation and where gaps exist to align with the community work is under way.
- Working at a community level to improve systems and support of the Community & Safety Well Being Advisory Committee work. Using system driven methods and the support of new programs focusing on upstream prevention rather than a reaction response.
- The Municipality is not mandated to operate or deliver the types of services required. A Community buy in is required and shared responsibilities of this Advisory Committee to take on this work.
- Action tables are set up to share the workload, but do not have a seat at the table. They are doing some of the work but no reporting mechanism back to the Advisory Committee on what actions they have taken to move the plan forward. Currently updates are available through staff resources.
- Existing action tables identified in the plan were not specifically set up for the Community Safety & Well-Being Committee and have existed for 20 – 30 years have agreed to assist with the work.
- A discussion was held relative to finding a better way to integrate accessing minutes and/or activities the action tables have undertaken.
- A suggestion was made to reach out to Advisory Committee members that sit on additional action tables and other community action groups to provide input from their tables. Keeping in mind they are not accountable to this table. Each action table to offer support to the Community Safety & Well-Being Advisory Committee and their responsibilities they are legislated to create.
- Legislation prescribes that specific sectors be represented this Advisory Committee and a representative from each of those sectors have been met.

10. CSWB Advisory Committee Alignment

With the new governance model at the City of Thunder Bay, several Committees of Council have been dissolved as official Committees of Council, but Administration is working on transition plans to ensure the work of those groups continue. Two such groups are the former Earthcare Advisory Committee and the Anti-Racism & Equity Advisory Committee. It is being proposed that these two groups become Resource Groups that can support the efforts of, and provide additional context to, the CSWB Advisory Committee.

Community Safety & Well-Being Advisory Committee, because it is legislated, remains a Committee of Council per the Municipal Act. Meetings remain open, quorum is required and are to be formally ran by the chair.

A discussion was held regarding the primary job of the Community Safety & Well-Being it to oversee the development, execution, and evaluation of the plan. The concern raised is that other community working groups or campaigns that may or not be part of the role of the Advisory Committee may water the work down. This will be monitored as we move forward.
